EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The first national Cuba Poll conducted by the Institute of Public Opinion Research (IPOP) of Florida International University's School of International and Latin American Studies measured the level of support within the Cuban-American community in Dade County for policies directed toward Cuba and found a diversity of opinions on what policies would facilitate political change on the island. The pollster, a leader and long resident of the technology/development industry, presented the results of the first such survey conducted in the University as signaling a strong desire to undertake multiple challenges to achieve political change on the island. Perhaps because of the widespread media focus on the political changes that have resulted in Eastern Europe, the investigators conclude that the Cuban-American community is willing to accept a variety of options to promote political and social change on the island.

According to the survey results, the Cuban-American community is willing to support or to demand rights groups working inside Cuba as well as other like organizations in the United States on the island who work to raise the living standards of the Cuban people and improve the living conditions of the Cuban people in the U.S. as well as on the island.

METHODOLOGY

From March 1 to March 6, 1981, the Institute of Public Opinion Research in Dade County, Florida conducted a survey of opinion about the manner of political change on Cuba. The survey was conducted in a series of focus groups and direct interviews with a total of 100 individuals about the diverse policies towards Cuba existing in the Cuban-American community, and to understand and explain them. The random sample was composed of 50 individuals who were selected in Dade County using random-digit dialing procedures which excluded all numbers beginning with 305. The survey was conducted in Spanish and English and was conducted by the Institute of Public Opinion Research at Florida International University.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The first annual Cuba Poll conducted by the Institute of Public Opinion Research (IPOR) of Florida International University's School of Journalism and Mass Communication measured the level of support within the Cuban-American community in Dade County for policies directed toward Cuba and found a diversity of opinions on what policies would facilitate political changes on the island. Drs. Guillermo J. Grenier and Hugh Gladwin, of the Sociology/Anthropology Department, interpret the results of the first such survey conducted by the University as signaling a deep desire to undertake multiple strategies to induce political changes on the island. Perhaps because of the unorthodox methods through which changes have resulted in Eastern Europe, the investigators conclude that the Cuban-American community is willing to encourage a variety of options to promote rapid and lasting changes on the island.

According to the survey results, the Cuban-American community is willing to lend support to human rights groups working inside Cuba as well as enter into negotiations to facilitate free elections on the island while at the same time they also support a tightening of the trade embargo and initiating military action by exile groups or even a U.S. invasion of the island.

METHODOLOGY

From March 2 to March 6, six hundred Cuban-Americans in Dade County, were asked a battery of questions about their support of policies toward Cuba. The ten minute questionnaire was a result of careful planning and design to insure that all attitudes about the diverse policies towards Cuba existing in the Cuban-American community could be expressed and recorded. The random sample was generated from all telephone exchanges in Dade County using standard random-digit-dialing procedures which ensure that each residential phone has an equal chance of being chosen for the sample. Bilingual (Spanish/English) interviewers conducted the interviews from IPOR's 24-station telephone lab at the North Miami Campus of Florida International University.

The margin of error for the full sample of 600 is +/-4% at the 95% confidence level. This means, for example, that for the result that eighty percent of the 600 respondents favor the tightening of the trade embargo, the chances are 95 out of 100 that the opinion of the entire Cuban-American population of Dade County will fall between 76 and 84 percent in favor of this position.

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SAMPLE

The demographic characteristics of the sample accurately represent the characteristics of the Cuban-American population in Dade County.

- Eighty-eight percent of respondents were born in Cuba and the remainder are children of at least one Cuban parent.
- Median age of sample is 49 years old. (All respondents were over 18 years of age.)
- Sixty percent of respondents have a family income under \$30,000.
- Ninety-four percent of the sample was white with one-half of one percent reporting to be Black and three and a half percent reporting to be Mulatto.
- Six percent of the Cuban born sample arrived in the United States before 1959, 50% arrived between 1959 and 1969, 13% arrived in the decade of the 1970s, and 17% arrived between 1980 and 1990 with a the majority of these (12.7%) arriving in 1980.
- 17% have visited Cuba since their arrival in the United States.
- Eighty percent of the sample still have relatives living on the island.
- Seventy-five percent of the questionnaires were administered in Spanish.

ANTICIPATION OF POLITICAL CHANGES IN CUBA

The survey results indicate that a vast majority of Cuban-Americans anticipate major political changes to occur in Cuba within the next five years.

- Thirty-five percent of Cuban-Americans expect major political changes to occur in Cuba within one year while an additional forty-four percent anticipate that major changes are more than one year but less than five years away.

POLICIES SUPPORTED TO PROMOTE POLITICAL CHANGE IN CUBA

The Cuban-American community supports a variety of policies to promote political changes on the island. In order of support, they are the following:

- Eighty-four percent favor supporting human rights groups working inside Cuba.
- Eighty-two percent favor negotiations to improve the human rights conditions on the island.
- Eighty percent favor the tightening of the trade embargo;
- Seventy-nine percent favor increasing international economic pressure on Cuba.
- Seventy-nine percent favor U.S. support of an armed internal rebellion to overthrow the Cuban government;
- Seventy-three percent favor negotiations with the Cuban government to allow Cuban family members to travel to the United States to join relatives living here.
- Seventy-one percent favor military action by the exile community against the Cuban government.
- Seventy percent favor maintaining the current policy of no diplomatic relations and no trade with Cuba;
- Fifty-nine percent favor starting negotiations with the Cuban government to facilitate peaceful democratic change by means of free-elections or plebiscite.
- Fifty-eight percent favor the starting of negotiations with the Cuban government to allow regular phone communications with the island.
- Fifty-six percent favor a United States invasion of Cuba.
- Forty-three percent favor negotiations to allow unrestricted travel by Cuban-Americans to the island to visit relatives.
- Thirty-six percent favor negotiations to exclude food and medicine from the trade embargo.
- Thirty-six percent favor the establishment of a national dialogue between Cuban exiles, Cuban dissidents, and representatives of the Cuban Government.

- Twenty-seven percent favor negotiations to allow unrestricted trade with Cuba.

In addition to asking whether they favor or opposed these policies, the respondents were asked to rank the policy which was most important to them.

- Approximately 15% of the respondents mentioned that support for internal rebellion (15.5%) and support for a U.S. invasion (15%) were the policies most important to them.
- Over nine percent indicated that the support of exile military action (9.7%) and the support of negotiations for free elections (9.2%) were the policies most important to them.

CHANGES IN PERSONAL PLANS IF CUBA'S GOVERNMENT CHANGES TO A DEMOCRACY

Another set of questions were designed measure the potential movement of Cubans between Miami and the island when political changes take place in Cuba.

- Eighty-two percent would be likely to return to visit the island if the country's government changed to a democracy.
- Fifty-nine percent indicated that they had relatives in Cuba who would be likely to travel to the United states if travel were unrestricted.
- Thirty-six percent of respondents would be likely to travel to Cuba if a change in the travel requirements would make such travel unrestricted.
- Thirty-two percent felt that relatives on the island would come to the United States to live if Cuba had a democratic government.
- Twenty-seven percent would likely return to live in Cuba if a democratic government were in power.

ON THE ISSUE OF A DIALOGUE AMONG ALL CUBANS AND THE CUBAN GOVERNMENT

Perhaps the most discussed division within the Cuban-American community in Dade County is that between those who support a dialogue among all Cubans and the Cuban government to expedite change on the island and those who oppose such a dialogue. The survey attempted to tap the differences between these two alleged groups by asking whether a respondent would favor or oppose "starting negotiations to establish a national dialogue between Cuban exiles,

Cuban dissidents, and representatives of the Cuban government." Excluding the respondents who did not answer the question or did not know if they would support such an initiative, forty percent of the respondents favored the establishment of such a national dialogue while sixty percent opposed it.

In general, the pro-dialogue respondents consistently voiced stronger support for negotiated change than those that opposed a national dialogue. This might be because those opposing a dialogue at this point feel it is unnecessary to discuss issues with a government that is clearly on the decline. Thirty-three percent of those opposing a dialogue believe that major political changes will occur in Cuba within a year while only twenty-two percent of those supporting dialogue see change as imminent.

While the differences between these two groups are real, the evidence indicates that there are points of agreement between the groups as well as sources of disagreement within each group. For example, while an overwhelming ninety-six percent of those in favor of a dialogue also favor supporting human rights groups in Cuba, a sizable majority of those opposing a dialogue (85%) also support such an initiative. Similarly, a mere ten percent of those opposing a dialogue favor negotiations to establish unrestricted trade with the island; yet, those favoring a dialogue are split on the issue, with only 53% voicing support for this policy.

The following is a comparison between the two groups on policy approaches towards Cuba. (Listed in descending order of support by those favoring a dialogue.)

- Ninety-one percent of supporters of a dialogue favor negotiations with the Cuban government to facilitate peaceful democratic change by means of free elections or plebiscite while forty percent of those opposing a dialogue support such an initiative.
- Eighty-eight percent of those favoring establishing a national dialogue favor negotiations for direct phone communications. (Forty-three percent of those opposing a national dialogue favor this policy.)
- Seventy percent of those favoring a dialogue also favor negotiations for unrestricted travel. (Only twenty-six percent of those opposing a dialogue favor this policy.)
- Sixty-one percent of those favoring a national dialogue also favor excluding food and medicine from the trade embargo. (Only twenty-one of those opposing a dialogue favor such a move.)
- Fifty-three percent of supporter of a dialogue also favor negotiating to establish unrestricted trade with the island while only ten percent of those opposing a dialogue support what amounts to be a lifting of the embargo.

- Fifty-one percent of dialogue supporters favor a U.S. invasion of Cuba while seventy-percent of those against a dialogue voiced this support.

POLICIES FAVORED BY SIZABLE MAJORITIES

Some policies receive support from a sizable majority of Cuban-Americans, regardless of their position on a national dialogue.

- Ninety-six percent of those favoring a dialogue also favor the support of human rights groups working within the island and eighty-five percent of those opposing a national dialogue also favor this policy.
- Ninety-six percent of those favoring a dialogue also favor negotiations to improve the conditions of human rights on the island and seventy-six percent of those opposing dialogue also favor this policy.
- Ninety-three percent of those favoring a dialogue also favor negotiations to allow relatives in Cuba to come to the U.S. to live and sixty-three percent of those opposed to a dialogue share this support.
- Seventy-eight of dialogue supporters favor the support of armed internal rebellion within the island and eighty- nine percent of those opposing the dialogue also favor this initiative.
- Seventy-seven percent of those supporting a dialogue also favor increasing international economic pressure on Cuba and ninety-two percent of those opposing a dialogue support this position.
- Seventy-six percent of those favoring a dialogue also favor tightening the trade embargo and ninety-four percent of those in opposition to a dialogue support a tightening of the embargo.
- Sixty-six percent of dialogue supporters favor military action by the exile community and eighty-four percent of those opposing a dialogue support this policy.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION USED BY THE RESPONDENTS TO RECEIVE NEWS ABOUT CUBA

A fourth set of questions measured the preferred source of information used by the respondents to receive news about Cuba. While some respondents mentioned various sources, the following is a breakdown of the different information media mentioned:

- Forty-five percent receive information about Cuba from some television source.
- Forty-one percent listen to the radio for information about Cuba.
- Thirty-one percent depend on newspapers for their primary source of information about Cuba.

The respondents who mentioned radio as a source of information about Cuba were the least likely to favor initiating a dialogue.

HOW TO READ THE TABLES IN THIS REPORT

Most of the questions asked in the survey appear in four sets of tables. First, two sets of frequency counts are presented. One is with the full set of responses to the question as well as "no response" or "don't know" answers categorized. This first table also includes a category in a few questions for a spontaneously given response of "I can't support that policy as long as Fidel and/or Raul Castro are in power". This response was coded separately by the interviewer. In the second set of frequency counts the responses are collapsed into two categories, usually "favor" vs. "opposed". In these counts the missing values are excluded and the "not with Fidel" responses coded as opposed.

The second set of tables are crosstabulations of the opinion questions with basic demographics and position on dialogue. In most cases these are presented in two sets as has been described above for the frequency counts. The percentages are all column percentages. For example the column under "male" gives the percentages for male respondents adding up to approximately 100 percent. Due to slight differences in rounding the percentages may not add up to exactly 100. In a few cases differences in rounding .5% to the next full percent gives a 1% discrepancy between percentages quoted in this executive summary and those shown in the tables.

It must be emphasized that it is not possible to generalize to the Cuban-American population of Dade County from results in the crosstabulation tables which show very few counted responses. For example, if a 10% difference of 45% vs 55% is found for a subgroup which numbers only 65 respondents, that difference may only be due to chance variation in the sample. It is not valid to generalize from that result to the entire Cuban-American population of Dade County. At the end of this report a margin of error table is given so readers may determine whether or not results are significant estimates of the population response. In the example just given, with 65 respondents and a response of 45%, the margin of error is somewhere between 9.8 and 13.8%, larger than the 10% difference.
