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

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We've been hearing a lot about immigration during these elections. With over 11 million undocumented immigrants living in the United States it is a challenge that demands our attention. Too often though, the conversation stays firmly rooted in politics. Politics, by nature and necessity, focuses on the big picture and some politicians find it convenient and effective to frame the debate with generalizations and cultural stereotypes that use fear to divide us.

The theatre is a different animal however. It aims to dive deep below the surface and examine the complexities of the human condition. It focuses on individual stories and in doing so helps us understand that deep down we are more alike than different. *The Pot* tells the story of one American family who does not have the luxury of treating immigration as an "issue" – there is something much deeper at stake.



This production is entered in the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival (KCACTF). The aims of this national theater education program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for a response by a regional KCACTF representative, and selected students and faculty are invited to participate in KCACTF programs involving scholarships, internships, grants and awards for actors, directors, dramaturgs, playwrights, designers, stage managers and critics at both the regional and national levels.

Productions entered on the Participating level are eligible for invitation to the KCACTF regional festival and may also be considered for national awards recognizing outstanding achievement in production, design, direction and performance.

Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
