Background

FIU'S DIGITAL LIBRARY

The mission of the Florida International University (FIU) Digital Collections Center is to build online collections of enduring value for the university and broader user community by identifying, digitizing, and preserving information resources of scholarly, educational, and civic interest.

The Center's digital collections focus on local and regional materials of historical, scientific, cultural, and educational importance. FIU's locally hosted digital library system, dPanther, is home to over 62,700 items in over 80 collections, which are contributed by FIU's university and community partners.

FIU'S INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY

FIU's Institutional Repository is a full-text, online, open access repository and publishing platform for the scholarship, creative output and history of FIU. The goals of the repository are to:

- Serve as a persistent and centralized access point for FIU scholarship and creative works
- Promote faculty and student research to a global community
- Preserve the history, growth and development of FIU
- Provide a platform for faculty to post Open Access copies of publications to meet OA requirements of funding agencies.

The repository is hosted by Berkley Electronic Press (BePress), which boasts a strong network of over 500 institutions across the globe. Our repository hosts over 16,500 papers, presentations, reports, images, and videos from over 60 departments and centers. More information is available at: http://digitalcommons.fiu.edu/about.html

FIU'S CARIBBEAN COLLECTIONS

FIU's Caribbean collections are hosted in the Digital Library of the Caribbean (dLOC). These FIU Special Collections materials consist of documents, photographs, maps, videos, music, artwork and rare books, with an emphasis on the history, literature, culture, architecture and arts of the countries of the Caribbean basin. Collection materials include the Enrique Hurtado de Mendoza Collection of Cuban Genealogy, Flora of the Caribbean, Abeng and Struggle newspapers, as well as Cuban pamphlets and postcards. FIU's Caribbean Collections are comprised of over 6,500 titles.


DIGITAL COLLECTIONS GROWTH


- The Digital Library and Institutional Repository accomplished significant growth this past year, with 24,785 additional files added to the online repositories, and a grand total of 86,330 items / 292,400 files.
- This year there was a strong focus on supporting access to *University Archives* materials in Digital Commons. Collections include the BBC Student Government Associations Image Archive, FIU in View, and continued development of the *Department of Theatre Archive*.
- The Digital Library established several *new community partnerships*, hosting collections from the *Virginia Key Beach Park* archives as well as the *Hampton House*, with continued partnerships including the *Monroe Public Library* and the *City of Miami Beach*.
- We continue to publish and archive *electronic theses and dissertations (ETDs)*, which include the
 works of new FIU graduates as well as retrospective digitization of theses and dissertations dating
 back to the opening of the university. *238 new ETDs and 224 retrospective ETDs* were published
 and archived in 2017/2018.

DIGITAL COLLECTIONS USAGE

In total, FIU's Digital Library, Caribbean Collections, and Institutional Repository materials received *5.7 million views/downloads* during the 2017/2018 fiscal year.

ANNUAL USAGE/GROWTH AT A GLANCE






Readership Distribution

New Projects & Partnerships



ZOO MIAMI

In May 2017, the FIU Libraries' *Government Resources and Information Department* acquired the *Zoo Miami Collection*, with the purpose of creating access to a vast array of visual and textual resources, thus advancing a permanent digital memory of the zoo's historical archive. The Zoo Miami Digital Collection presents a curated selection of textual and visual materials related to Florida's largest zoo. This collection offers a historical retrospective of the zoo, from their days as the *Crandon Zoological Park* in Key Biscayne, their monumental relocation to Southern Miami and rebranding as *Miami MetroZoo*, to their current progressive incarnation as Zoo Miami. An intimate look of people instrumental in the development of the zoo, as well as their relationship with the animals inhabiting it, are some of the most prominent topics found in this collection: http://dpanther.fiu.edu/dPanther/collections/zoo.

STUDENT NEWSPAPERS

The FIU Special Collections and University Archives 1,116 issues of FIU Student Newspapers. The student newspaper provides a wealth of information on the formation of the university, the history of FIU, sports, and student life. The newspaper has gone through several name changes, discontinuations, and at one time two student newspapers were published concurrently. FIU's first student paper was the 4-page newsletter, Action, published on November 17, 1972. LIBERTAD LAMARQUE SHEET MUSIC COLLECTION

The *Libertad Lamarque Sheet Music Collection* Preservation Project was funded by the *Southeast Florida Library Information Network* (*SEFLIN*) through the Breakthrough Awards in 2018. The digitization purpose was to preserve a physical and digital format, archive the original print materials, promote the content of about 250 unique sheets of music by creating access to sheets music from 1910-1965 through the FIU dPanther digital repository. VIRGINIA KEY BEACH PARK TRUST



FIU's *Department of History* and Libraries' *Digital Collections Center* have partnered with the *Virginia Key Park Trust* on a two year, Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) funded grant to digitize the Trust's archives. The Virginia Key Beach Park Trust collection includes an oral history and photographic collection containing interviews from activists and citizens who participated in or experienced South Florida segregation and the mid 1940's civic activism that was the foundation for the creation of the segregated Virginia Key Beach in 1945 (now Historic Virginia Key Beach Park) and its current restoration through the efforts of the Virginia

Key Beach Park Trust. Interviewees discuss their personal beliefs, political activism, and current issues involving the restoration and preservation of the beach. Each person uniquely recounts their personal experiences and histories about the beach, including stories about relatives, friends, and both political and personal battles in the segregated climate. Each interviewee tells their history of the park in a unique, engaged way, offering a personal detailed account, as well as a plan of action to implement a museum and a rejuvenated historical environment. http://dpanther.fiu.edu/dPanther/collections/vkt

HISTORIC HAMPTON HOUSE

The *Historic Hampton House* has partnered with FIU Libraries on a History Harvest event funded by a Breakthrough Digitization Award from the *Southeast Florida Library and Information Network (SEFLIN)*. Designated a local Miami-Dade historical landmark by the Miami-Dade County Historic Preservation Board in 2002, the Hampton House organizes community events, including History Harvests for the preservation of important, historic, community donated materials, with the goal of documenting and preserving Miami's local history. Materials in this collection include photographs, newspaper clippings, audio recordings, and more.

MIAMI SHORES VILLAGE ARCHIVES AT BROCKWAY MEMORIAL LIBRARY



The *Brockway Memorial Library* has partnered with FIU Libraries on a Breakthrough Digitization grant from the *Southeast Florida Library and Information Network.* The Miami Shores Archives at Brockway Memorial Library consists of a collection of over 1,000 photographs, newspaper clippings, public records, books and other historical materials related to the history of Miami Shores Village, Florida. The materials, many dating from ca. 1925, have been gathered from several sources, with the largest amount having come from the collection of C. Lawton McCall, a long-time Village Manager (1935-1968) and Dr. Thelma

Peters, a historian who devoted most of her research to the northeast area of Miami-Dade County. In 1999, the Library Board of Trustees and members of the Miami Shores Historic Preservation Board undertook the task of cataloging and properly storing these materials, creating a research facility for residents and visitors interested in learning more about the Village Beautiful. The DPLA is a Boston-based national digital library that brings together collections from the nation's libraries, archives, museums, and other cultural heritage institutions. Since its launch in 2013, the DPLA has become a free, open, and accessible national digital resource, with a collective of more than 2,900 institutions, sharing over 20 million photographs, books, maps, news footage, oral histories, personal letters, museum objects, artwork, government documents, and so much more.

"DPLA and SSDN offer a tremendous opportunity to share the depth and richness of our state's digital collections," said Anne Prestamo, dean of Libraries at FIU. "We look forward to advising and assisting libraries, museums and archives throughout South and Central Florida to fully leverage that potential." -- <u>FIU News</u>, 12/29/2017

To date, the Sunshine State Digital Network includes 169,973 digital items. New organizations are being brought onboard to contribute to DPLA each quarter. Current contributing institutions include, Florida Memory (78,171), University of Miami Libraries (45,643), Florida State University Libraries (35,789), Florida International University Libraries (5,643), First Baptist Church of Tallahassee (2,033), City of Coral Gables (1,774), Monroe County Public Library (805), Miami Design Preservation League, Close-Up Productions (105), Vaclav Havel Library Foundation (10). FIU is the hosting institution for partner collections such as City of Coral Gables, Monroe County Public Library, Vaclav Havel Library Foundation, and the Miami Design Preservation League, Close-Up Productions.




