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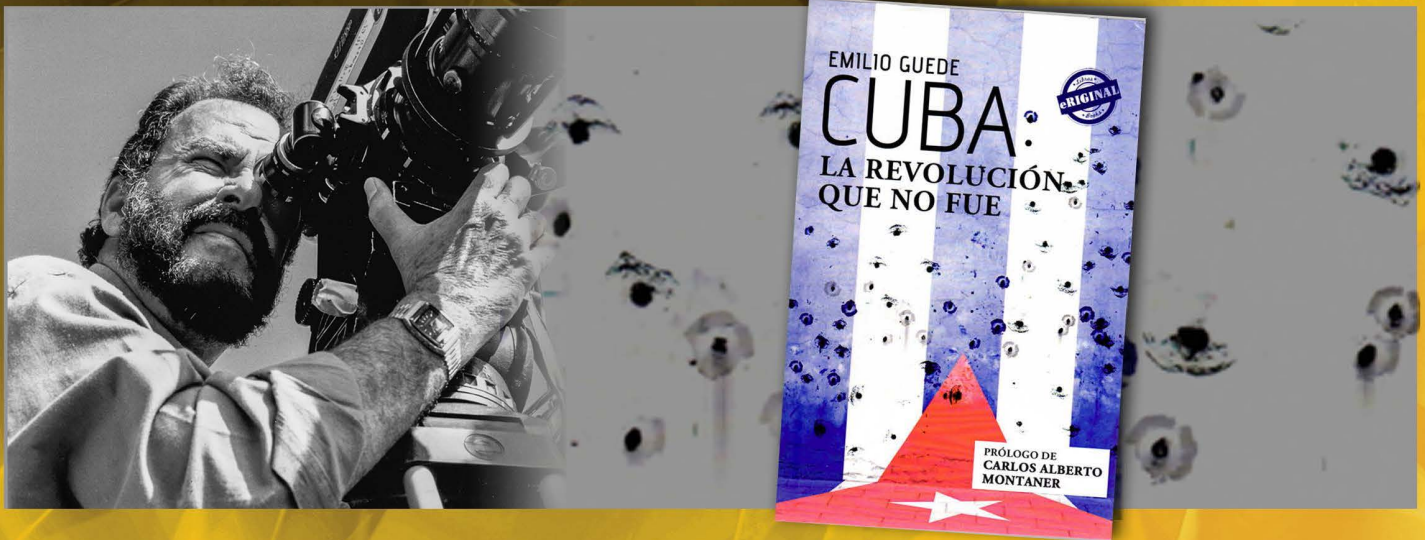

Cuba: La revolución que no fue (2012) is a powerful book of memoirs and reflections by one of the main propaganda chiefs against Fulgencio Batista's dictatorship. Soon after the triumph of the Cuban Revolution, Emilio Guede became disillusioned with the new government. As a witness with privileged access to information, the author reveals new insights into the early years of the revolutionary process. He also offers a detailed account of the trial and execution of General Arnaldo Ochoa in 1989. Guede's book presents a serene and well-documented synthesis of many important historical events in Cuba over the past 70 years.

Emilio Guede was born in Matanzas, Cuba. Since 1946, he worked as a photographer and cameraman. In 1960, he left Cuba for Spain, where he was appointed Radio and TV Manager for the advertising agency Guastella Iberoamericana. After a brief stay in Miami, he moved to Puerto Rico, where he worked as a commercial photographer, director, cameraman, and independent producer of TV commercials. In 1965 he founded Guede Films, Inc., which operated until 2003, and later established TV Films.
