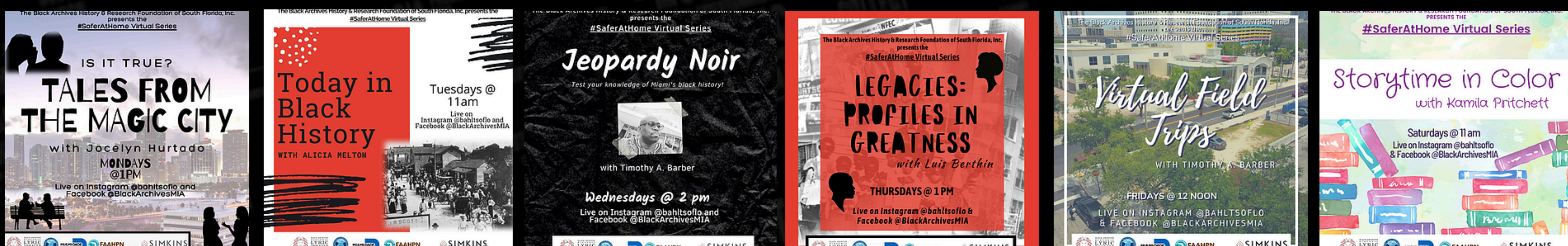


Into the Limelight: Staying Connected In Unprecedented Times

The Safer-At-Home episodes were live streamed daily, six days a week. Each series focused on a different aspect of Black Miami. In order, an exploration of Miami's mysteries, highlighted stories and achievements of Black figures locally and nationwide, profiles of important figures of Black Miami's past, trivia game focused on local and national Black history, a digital voyage through Black Miami's landmarks and a children's story time session with special guest readers, reading books authored by African - Americans.

Panels

Our panels were reflective of recent events in the county protests and the social justice movement. The Black Archives topical discussions focused not only around the contemporary narrative but also gave historical context. The panels examined: The words of Frederick Douglass and his views on the 4th of July, The difficulties in preserving critical moments in history, The importance of community archives, How community & religious figures impacted the civic rights of Black Miami, The fight for beach access across America.
