




PRINT EBOOK

- Print budget
 - FY11 36%
 - FY12 35%
 - usage=29% CIRC>1
 - 71% print were never checked out!
 - FY13 25%
 - Other considerations
 - Out of print
 - Shipping costs
 - Time delay from triggered to delivered and cataloged

- EBook budget and usage
 - FY11 64%
 - FY12 65%
 - usage=71% ACCESS>1
 - 29% ebooks were never accessed
 - FY13 75%
- Other considerations
 - 24/7 access
 - Accessible from anywhere
 - Free use for 1 page





Ebrary PDA (FY 12-FY13)

- Profile primarily focused on Spanish-language e-books for the subject areas:
 - Education
 - Business/Economics
- Absence of a Subject Selector responsible for the assigned areas precipitated the need for the PDA and funds to be spent
- Lack of physical space in North Miami Beach branch library required purchase of "virtual" materials
- Allocation for FY12 and FY13:
 - \$5,000.00 with University Purchase Order
- Perpetual rights/archive license with Multiple User Model (MUPO)



FIU's 2011 Ebrary PDA Pilot – 2012 stats

- Of 626 titles purchased from the PDA pilot:
 - 372 were used in 2012; 254 had no usage.
 - 59% of the PDA-purchased books continued being used into 2012.
- In terms of overall 2012 usage of the ebrary collection, only 32% of ebrary titles used were from the PDA project BUT PDA accounted for:

60% of the user sessions

77% of the page views

58% of the pages printed

64% of the titles which patrons request to be in the Wait Queue

70% of the chapter downloads

62% of the full book downloads

PDA titles only account for 25% of the cost of e-books accessed in 2012 (overall cost of titles used was \$115,000; the PDA books account for \$28,000 of that)



MylLibrary PDA (FY 14)

Profile primarily focused for the subject areas:

Class H - Social Sciences (Business) Class D-F - History (World; Americas)

Class P - Philosophy; Psychology Class Q - Sciences

Intended targeted audience:

- UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL
- Expanded to include GRADUATE LEVEL in Sciences due to lack of matches in MARC record loads

Subject Selector vacancies required the use of PDA as a substitute tool for collection development

Allocation for FY14:

• \$10,000.00 with a University Purchase Order

Explicit instructions for Single User license (SUPO)

Wiley Usage Based Content Model UBCM

Pros

- Get the [entire] publisher catalog
- Generally no requirement for any specific title purchases
- Don't need to worry about duplication with already purchased e-titles
- Can order additional titles based on known usage

Cons

- Limited to one publisher
- Multiple plans = multiple deposit payments
- What are you institutional regulations for deposit accounts?

Cost Effectiveness of the Shared PDA

Cost

Per

Use

- The cost per book purchased averages \$188, with a cost per use of \$19.60
- However, it is worth noting that the plan has no fees for less than three uses of a book, which in most plans would trigger a short term loan (STL) fee. When the usage of books which have not yet been triggered for purchase are factored into the cost per use mode, the overall cost per use of the entire plan is \$14.89.

PDA Life Cycle

Profiling: based on retrospective, based on need, wishlist, approval slips, replacements, ILL.

MARC Loading: discovery records, purchased records, frequency. Delete records vs. batch deletion. Keep duplicate records – different simultaneous users.

Triggers & Tracking: vendor specific, short term loans. Only know who last triggered it on consortium level.

Invoicing: frequency.

Analysis: (closes loop), good profile?

Analysis

- Titles triggered
- Titles to be removed, title accessed remain in pool, some titles permanent, some subjects/publishers remain

Profiling

- Existing AP
- Collection Gap

Our first PDA (Ebrary)
increased our catalog
access value in FY12 by
\$38,000 but we only
paid for what was used:
\$7,200





We Interrupt This Program...

Newsflash!

Our second PDA (MylLibrary) increased our catalog access value in FY14 by \$73,889 but we only paid for what was used: \$11,644



We Interrupt This Program...

Newsflash!

Our current PDA (MylLibrary) increases our catalog access value by \$87,160


The possibilities
