THREE SISTERS by Anton Chekhov

The Moscow Art Theatre staged the first production of Anton Chekhov's drama in 1901. Since that time the play has earned its rightful place as one of Russia's most important works of modern theatre.

Chekhov's play presents a vivid view of Russia life at the turn of the century as he exposes the dreams, sufferings and passions of a privileged, educated class caught in a twilight existence suspended between nostalgic idealism and a disintegrating social order. As the winds of political change began to sweep the nation, a whole class of people fell prey to disillusionment brought on by their own powerlessness.

The action takes place in the provincial home of the Prozorov family. Three sisters and a brother are caught within the confines of their estate and the past: Masha, trapped in a joyless marriage, finds only fleeting fulfillment in an ill-fated affair; Olga, dedicated school mistress unflaggingly supplies her concern for others while stifling any possibility of achieving self-realization; and Irena, whose youthful aspirations and optimism are slowly drained by the prospect of returning to Moscow, the birthplace and center of all their hopes.

Chekhov does not leave us with a pessimistic scenario, however. Aided by an array or rich and varied characters, the three sisters return to a point of unification and hope.
