story, "Perversion of Justice," at the Miami Book Fair. The well-written page-turner is reminiscent of Woodward & Bernstein's "All the President's Men."

The multi-talented **CHARLES M. BLOW** has been a **New York Times** Opinion columnist since 2008. His column appears on Monday and Thursday. Blow joined the New York Times in 1994 as a graphics editor and quickly became the paper's graphics director, before leaving in 2006 to become the art director of **National Geographic** magazine. In May, 2021, "Prime with

Charles Blow" premiered on the **Black News Channel (BNC)**. Blow is also the author of "**The Devil You Know**" and "**Fire Shut Up in My Bones**," was adapted into an opera by Terence

Blanchard and Kasi Lemmons – the first opera by a Black composer performed by the Metropolitan Opera at Lincoln Center.

SHEILA ELIAS is a multi-faceted artist who is constantly seeking new materials and resources to interpret and express her internal landscape. Her work ranges in scale from 10 x 16 feet to pieces created on an iPad. Regarding her adopted hometown, she says, "Miami, where multi-cultural history and the future clash on a daily basis, is a luminous kaleidoscope of raw, sincere emotions and harsh realities; urban tension mixed

with profound beauty, compassion and optimism."

MATTHEW SALLEH. They are focused on honest and authentic content, with a global and cinematic scope. Rose Tucker is a producer, sound recordist, and editor. Matthew Salleh is a director, cinematographer, and editor. Their first two films, "Barbeque" and "We Don't Deserve Dogs," are brilliantly titled and present examples of both topics from across the globe.

SUSAN WESTFALL is a playwright who grew up in Miami and has been living on Key Biscayne for many years. In 1996, Westfall co-founded City Theatre, the only professional

theatre in the country dedicated to developing and producing new short form plays and musicals (i.e. 10-15 minutes). City

Designer Yasmin Spiro, daughter of artist Tina Spiro (whose interview we published in 2019) and architect Eran Spiro, introduced me to Phyllis Jones of the International Interior Design Association (IIDA), a global organization that is based in Chicago. Jones introduced my to KENZIE LEON PERRY,

Perry is leading the "**Design Your World**" program in Miami, a summer survey course for talented high school students interested in a career in architecture or design.
