BRIAN SCHRINER

Brian Schriner is an educator, administrator, fundraiser, strategic thinker, and change-maker with a 34-year track record of collaboration and success in higher education. He was appointed Dean of the FIU College of Communication, Architecture + The Arts (CARTA) in 2009 and serves as the university's Cultural Arts Liaison for the Office of the Provost, which includes collaborating with the University's three accredited museums: The Wolfsonian-FIU, the FIU Phillip and Patricia Frost Art Museum, and the FIU Jewish Museum of Florida.

As an interdisciplinary college with a unique group of disciplines, CARTA is united through its mission

"Creative Forces At Work" and its commitment to prepare diverse leaders with global perspectives through applied learning, research, and creative activities. Composed of four schools, eight academic departments, and five centers/institutes, Schriner has grown the CARTA's diverse student body by 230% to more than 4,000 students from 91 countries (70% Hispanic; 11% African American; and 72% female) and its world class faculty by 100% (140 full-time and 150 part-time faculty). Schriner founded and established CARTA's

collaborative interdisciplinary spaces, CARTA Mana Wynwood, in the heart of Miami's Wynwood Art District, as well as the School of Architecture's Miami Beach Urban Studios (MBUS) and the college's Department of Art + Art History's Miami Beach Visual Arts Gallery, both in the heart of South Beach. Schriner also established the South Florida Media Network's news bureaus in Miami, New York City, and Washington, DC, and he secured and/or expanded several studentcentric, public-private partnerships, such as those with NBCUniversal Academy, TelevisaUnivision (STEP: Student Training and Employment Program), McClatchy, Hearst, Scripps-Howard, the Knight Foundation, the Ratcliffe Foundation, the Caplin Family Foundation, the Berkowitz Family Foundation, Island TV, Mana Contemporary, and Miami Dade College's MAGIC Studio. Dean Schriner is the publisher of Inspicio Arts.
