We should note that ever since the COVID-19 pandemic began in February 2020, we have been recording some of *ArtSpeak's* video interviews via Zoom. THE CURRENT EDITION OF *ArtSpeak* features our second video interview with Cuban-American cover person **LEONOR ANTHONY**. Anthony is a multi-disciplinary artist and activist

based in Miami. Born in Havana, Cuba, she immigrated to the United States with her family as a young child. In 2019, Anthony co-authored "Sounds of Freedom" with photographer Roberto Polillo, an extraordinary book of photographs and artwork about African-American jazz legends performing in Europe during the Jim Crow era. In October 2022, Anthony was awarded The Arctic Circle Fellowship and sailed the waters around the North Pole with 27 Artists and scientists in an unequaled and exclusive ecological Artist Residency. As a result of this experience, Anthony is currently producing, directing and editing her first full length documentary film titled "Ice Breaking."

LAWRENCE WRIGHT is an author, screenwriter, playwright, and staff writer for The New Yorker magazine. I have read five of his eleven books – all deeply informative page-turners.

He is an extraordinary researcher and storyteller. In 2007, his book about the rise of al-Qaeda, "The Looming Tower: Al-Qaeda and the Road to 9/11," received a Pulitzer Prize

for nonfiction. He co-wrote the screenplay for "The Siege," starring Denzel Washington, Annette Benning, and Bruce Willis, which is based on a story by Wright. And in 2006, Wright premiered his first one-man play, "My Trip to Al-Qaeda," at The New Yorker Festival, which led to a sold-out six-week run off-Broadway.

RICHARD MILSTEIN is the Chair of the Adrienne Arsht Center Trust (AACT) Board of Directors. He has been an active member of the Arsht Center Trust Board of Directors since 2008, supporting the Center's commitment to connecting all people to the arts, to the Arsht Center and to each other. Since opening in 2006, the Arsht Center has been recognized as a catalyst for billions of dollars in new development in the

downtown Miami area, a leader in artistic programming that mirrors South Florida's diversity, a host venue for historic events, and Miami's hub for arts education. We recorded our video conversation with Richard Milstein in the inspiring lobby

He has a special affinity for the music of his native France and is a passionate advocate for music of the 21st century.

CECILIA VIOLETTA LÓPEZ was born in the tiny town of Rupert, Idaho to Mexican immigrant parents. Her earliest memory is

singing with her mother in the sugar beet fields. Eventually she sang Mariachi music and then became an operatic soprano. López was named one of "Idaho's Top 10 Most Influential"

Women of the Century" by USA Today and one of opera's "25 Rising Stars" by Opera News. She has performed with many opera companies, including the Florida Grand Opera.

ROBERT PINSKY is a poet, essayist, translator, teacher, and speaker. His first two terms as United States Poet Laureate were marked by such visible dynamism—and such national enthusiasm in response—that the Library of Congress appointed him to an unprecedented third term. Throughout his career, Pinsky has been dedicated to identifying and invigorating

around the world. Since 2018 he has been working with the Emerson Prison Initiative, teaching incarcerated men at MCI-Concord. He is also the author of five books of fiction and

ILISA ROSAL is a Miami-based professional Flamenco Dancer, Choreographer, Artistic Director, and **Founder of Ballet Flamenco La Rosa** (BFLR), an International professional company dedicated to Flamenco as an ever-evolving art form. Rosal is also steeped in theatre and creates unique combinations of Flamenco and sophisticated drama – for example, "A Streetcar Named Desire." Her groundbreaking approach develops the connection between Flamenco and other styles of dance and music – like Jazz, Tap, Blues, American Country Music, Middle Eastern, Afro-Cuban, Afro-Haitian, African, Sephardic, Indian Dance, and Celtic Music and Dance — exploring the common elements and developing new dance forms.
