For over three decades, *Cuban Studies* has been the preeminent journal for scholarly work on Cuba. Published each winter, the journal features articles on Cuba in both English and Spanish, a large book review section, and an exhaustive compilation of recent works in the field. Widely praised for its interdisciplinary approach and trenchant analysis of an array of topics, each volume showcases the best scholarship in the humanities and social sciences.

In addition to papers in history, culture, and politics, Volume 43 contains a central dossier on demography. This dossier charts some of the important changes experienced by the Cuban population—a concept that includes those living abroad—and some of the challenges posed by those changes (such as aging or the changing composition of the expatriate community). Volume 44 features articles on recent economic issues in Cuba, public health policies, and José Martí's death as a myth of the Cuban nation-building project, among other topics.
