The 2016 FIU Cuba Poll:

How Cuban Americans in Miami View U.S. Policies Toward Cuba

First conducted in 1991, the FIU Cuba Poll is the longest-running research project tracking the opinions of the Cuban-American community in South Florida. From the beginning, Drs. Guillermo J. Grenier and Hugh Gladwin, faculty members in the Department of Global and Sociocultural Studies, have directed the survey. The poll was designed to measure the views of Cuban Americans about U.S. policy options toward Cuba. The consistency of some of the responses, as well as the shift in others, provides the most complete picture of Cuban-American political attitudes over time.

Dr. Guillermo J. Grenier is Professor of Sociology at Florida International University. He has authored or coauthored seven books and dozens of articles on labor, migration, immigrant incorporation, and the Cuban-American community, particularly in Miami. His latest book (with Corinna J. Moebius) is *A History of Little Havana* (2015).

Dr. Hugh Gladwin is Associate Professor of Anthropology at Florida International University. He is the author of numerous publications on disaster mitigation, public health, and public opinion, especially among Cuban Americans. He is the coeditor of *Hurricane Andrew: Ethnicity, Gender, and the Sociology of Disaster* (1997).

The 2016 FIU Cuba Poll was funded by several FIU units: the President's Office, the Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs, the Cuban Research Institute, the Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center, the Office of External Relations, and the College of Communication, Architecture, and the Arts.
