Manuel Mendive (b. 1944) was part of the first peneration of Cuban artists to emerge from Cuba's national fine arts academy. San Aleiandro, affiler 1959, Regarded as one of the foremost contemporary artists in Cuba and the Caribbean, Mendium incomposates visual elements pooted in West African religious and visual traditions into his painting. This lecture will look at the formative influences on Mendive's early work and will evolute his mainstream academic training, the contestual impact of his local community, and the effect of his African consciousness.

Dr. Rücharn Martinez-Ruiz is Associate Professor of African and African Discoper Art History and Head of the Department of Art History & Discourse of Art at the University of Cane Town in South Africa. He earned his Ph.D. and M.A. in Art History at Yale University and his R.A. in Art History at the University of Hausea. Cultus He has held teaching positions at Stanford University the Bhode Island School of Design, and the the Higher Institute of Art in Hasana. He was revently appointed as a Leverhuline Visiting Professor at the University of Oxford. His busics include Francisco the World Russettrian Act and Minestina in Central Africa Seth coming in 2017) and Konna Graphic Writing and Other Nametings of the Sinn (2013). In 2012-13, Dr. Martinez-Buit curated the exhibit Thinns that Connet Re-Seen Any Other Wise: The Art of Manual Mendive at the Frost Art Museum in Miami.
