## Galicia - Cuba: A Musical Journey Through The Galician Song Cántiga, Unha noite By Estíbaliz Santamaría Cadaval

During the 19th century, Galicia underwent a deep economic and social crisis. This downturn forced thousands of Galicians to emigrate and Cuba was the principal destination. Modeled on the French *mélodie* and the German *lied*, they created their distinctive song: canción galega. Some of these songs became popular and achieved success thanks to the national and international artists that included them on their repertoire.

This illustrated lecture will showcase one of the most important examples of the dimension achieved by this genre, the song: Cántiga, Unha noite composed by the Galician poet Curros Enríquez and musicians Alonso Salgado and José Castro Chané. Cuban artist Chalía Herrera recorded it in 1912 along with the very popular habanera  $T\dot{u}$ . The 78 rpm record is part of the FIU Díaz-Ayala Cuban and Latin American Music Collection.

This lecture will be presented in Spanish by Estíbaliz Santamaría Cadaval, doctoral student in Musicology at the Universidad Complutense de Madrid.
