For several decades, Emilio Cueto has assembled one of the largest private collections in the world of Cuban-related material, including newspapers, maps, artworks, books, prints, scores, LPs, videos, and posters. The collection is widely known as *La Emilioteca*, a play on the Spanish word for library, *biblioteca*. Cueto's two apartments on the outskirts of Washington, D.C., contain thousands of historical documents, antiques, and memorabilia. The collection is particularly strong in ts materials on colonial prints, graphic arts, music, and religion in Cuba and its diaspora.

This roundtable will feature several academic experts and collectors, who will discuss the challenges of collecting objects related to Cuban culture, focusing on Cueto's extensive collection:
