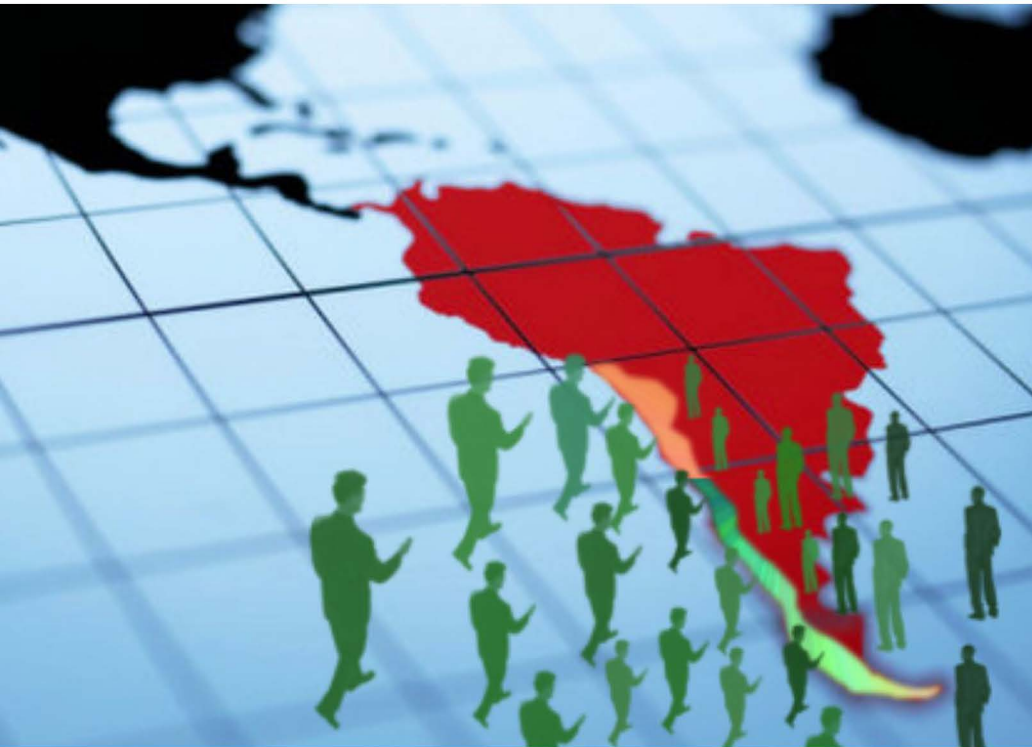

Cuban Migration to Chile Lecture by Nelson Jaime Santana

Chile has become the new frontier for thousands of migrants from Latin American countries. Among them are Cubans whose number has significantly increased in this Andean country within the last ten years. Many of these immigrants are professionals seeking to incorporate themselves into Chilean society, which is very different from their native country. Their labor trajectory is the object of the research conducted by Nelson Jaime Santana. In this lecture, Jaime Santana will share the preliminary results of his work in progress and offer a brief overview of Cubans living in Santiago de Chile. He will examine the particularities of their work experiences and thereby analyze one of the most complex phenomena affecting Chilean society.

Nelson Jaime Santana is currently a Visiting Scholar at FIU's Cuban Research Institute. He is a Ph.D. candidate in Sociology at the Alberto Hurtado University in Santiago de Chile. He also holds a master's degree in Sociology from the University of Havana and a B.A. in Sociology from the University of Oriente in Santiago de Cuba. He specializes in international migration, biographical studies, and cultural studies. His doctoral dissertation focuses on Cuban professionals migrating to Santiago de Chile.
