President Haspel started his report by welcoming new senators to the Council. President Haspel reported that:

- A microwave was acquired and set in the Cafeteria, in relation to the Microwave Resolution.
- Contract details were requested for the Panther Statue. BBC would have an exact replica that MMC will have.
- The Panther Paws design was ready and final permission from External Relations was needed.
- Second Road Access forums have changed to be more inclusive with the
 community. His administration was working with External Relations to see if also
 PTAs from neighbor schools can come and share concerns. The Forum date was
 set for October 18, it might change based on the availability of external relations,
 the Vice Provost and Facilities. Other administrators might be invited.
- He was on the process of getting a new Chief of Staff because the previous one
 was no longer in the Council. He will have someone for the Senate to appoint
 hopefully in the next week.
- A finalize date for the University-Wide Committee meeting was being worked.
 The meeting will be held at BBC.
- Lastly, both campuses endorsed Turbo Vote, service that allows students to register online to vote, send vote registration by mail and then people could send it back. Later, this service send reminders so people do not forget where to vote. President Haspel encouraged all senators to use this service if someone was not registered at the moment and let other people know about it. The goal was to register one thousand students but at the moment its development was in progress. The service is also open to faculty, staff and non-fiu student. Senators could help by going to turbovote.fiu.edu and check related e-mails sent by Council Clerk Adames.

Advisor Zapata gave more details about Turbo Vote and encouraged senators to help on this topic by registering people around campus with the SGA's iPads. The deadline for registering thru Turbo Vote would be soon by next week.
