INTERAMA CAMPUS PLAYAED

FIU BECOMES A REALITY

When Florida International University opened its doors some two months ago, few of the 5,667 enrolled students were aware of the efforts it took to open Dade County's first public upper division university. In 1965, when FlU officially was born, the state legislature also authorized the creation of two other.schools-the University of West Florida and the University of North Fla.

FIU is situated on 344 acros immediately south of Tamiami Trail between SW 107th and 117th Avenues on half of the old Tamiami Arport (the other half belongs to Metro and is planned to become a regional park with some of our sports facilities located there.

A second campus located on Interama land in North Miami is projected to be opened in 1976. La Deuxieme, which is nearing completion directly southwest of Primera Casa, will provide office space for most of the faculty while supplying the students with limited classrooms and a small auditorium.

The FIU library has a well-trained staff headed by Howard Cordell. The services include periodicals, government documents, microfilm and microfiche, archivhes, copy machines, and over thirty thousand volumes.

In academic areas, the university's College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business, School of Health & Social Sciences, Education and Hotel, Food and Travel Services, and the projected School of Technology have all been imjected with a new idea of forward thinking programs.
