BOR votes

Three Masters approved; two programs delayed

Three new Master's degree programs, including the first such study tracks for the School of Technology and College of Arts and Sciences, were approved by the Board of Regents in its September meeting here.

The only one of the three which is in effect Fall Quarter is the Master of Public Administration program in the School of Business and Organizational Sciences. It replaces an existing Public Administration track in the Master of Science in Management program.

Dr. George Sutija, Associate Dean, School of Business and Organizational Sciences, said the current degree program will be phased out immediately after the currently enrolled student graduates.

A MASTER'S Degree program in Psychology was also approved. Dr. Ronald Tikofsky, Chairman and Professor of Psychology, said that Florida International University will offer a graduate level course in the program in the 1977 Winter Quarter. He emphasized that no student will be formally admitted to the Master's program until 1977.

Students wishing to apply to the program should call the Department of Psychology at 552-2880, DM 430.

The BOR also approved a Master's Degree program in Water Quality and Aquatic Resources to begin in the 1977 Winter Quarter in the School of Technology's Division of Environmental and Urban Systems.

Dr. Daniel Jackson, division director and professor, said the program will deal with water pollution, drinking water problems and aquaculture.

IN LINE with the establishment of this program, FIU President Harold B. Crosby said FIU is developing a major water quality research center.

The BOR delayed a request for authorization to plan a Master's Degree program in Social Work. At the meeting, Thomas L. Norris, corresponding secretary of the South Florida Unit, National Association of Social Workers, Inc., spoke at length in support of establishing the Master's program at FIU.

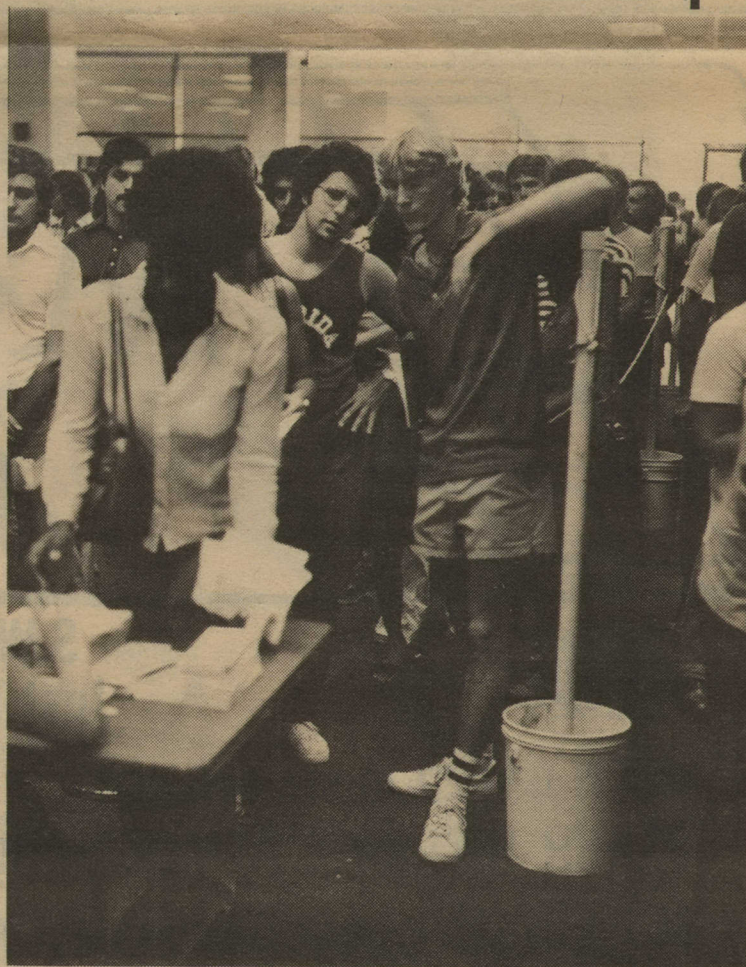
He said the program "would definitely fill in some crucial gaps" that exist in social work education in this region.

The BOR also delayed approval of a Master of Science degree in the Criminal Justice program in the School of Health and Social Services, the only School now without a Master's degree program.

Fall Festival 1976 welcomes students with films, fun

Emphasizing the future as its theme, FIU's fourth annual Fall Festival hopes to provide a little something for everyone. This year's all-day Festival will be Saturday, Oct. 2.

More than 5,000 are expected to attend the family event, which is the largest sponsored by the Student Government Association. The festival is designed as a "welcome back" for students and faculty and is also open to the public.

The day's activities will begin at 10 a.m. with events centered around UH. In keeping with the festival's "future" theme, three movies are scheduled: "Things To Come" at 10:15 a.m., "Star Trek" at noon and "2001: A Space Odyssey" at 1:45 p.m. They will be shown in the Cinema Center, UH 190.

For the youngsters, there will be a Moon Walk, pony rides, games and prizes. Puppet shows are scheduled for 2 and 4 p.m., and a clown show will begin at 1 p.m.

The day's events will climax at 6 p.m. with a free dance, featuring a live band and free beer.

"This should be a day of fun," said Director of Student Activities Lillian L. Kopenhaver. "We will have something to appeal to everyone."

Food will be available, featuring 10 cent hot dogs and 10 cent soft drinks. Various booths will be set up by clubs and organizations.

The Child Care Center at Florida International University has room for only 11 more children. If you are interested call 552-2143.

Accommodating the needs of 2½ to 5 year-olds, the Center is open from 7:45 a.m. to 6:15 p.m., Monday through Friday. Children can be enrolled in full time programs or can go to either morning or afternoon sessions.

The Center charges a fee on a sliding scale with each application being reviewed by the Finance Committee to determine the rate of pay.

Ideas such as self, family, community and senses are introduced through art, music, science, drama and physical education. Children are also taught pre-reading and math.

Snacks and juice or milk are provided for the children but they must bring their own lunch.

The Center is situated on the campus' west end, near the tennis courts, in a double trailer with red steps.

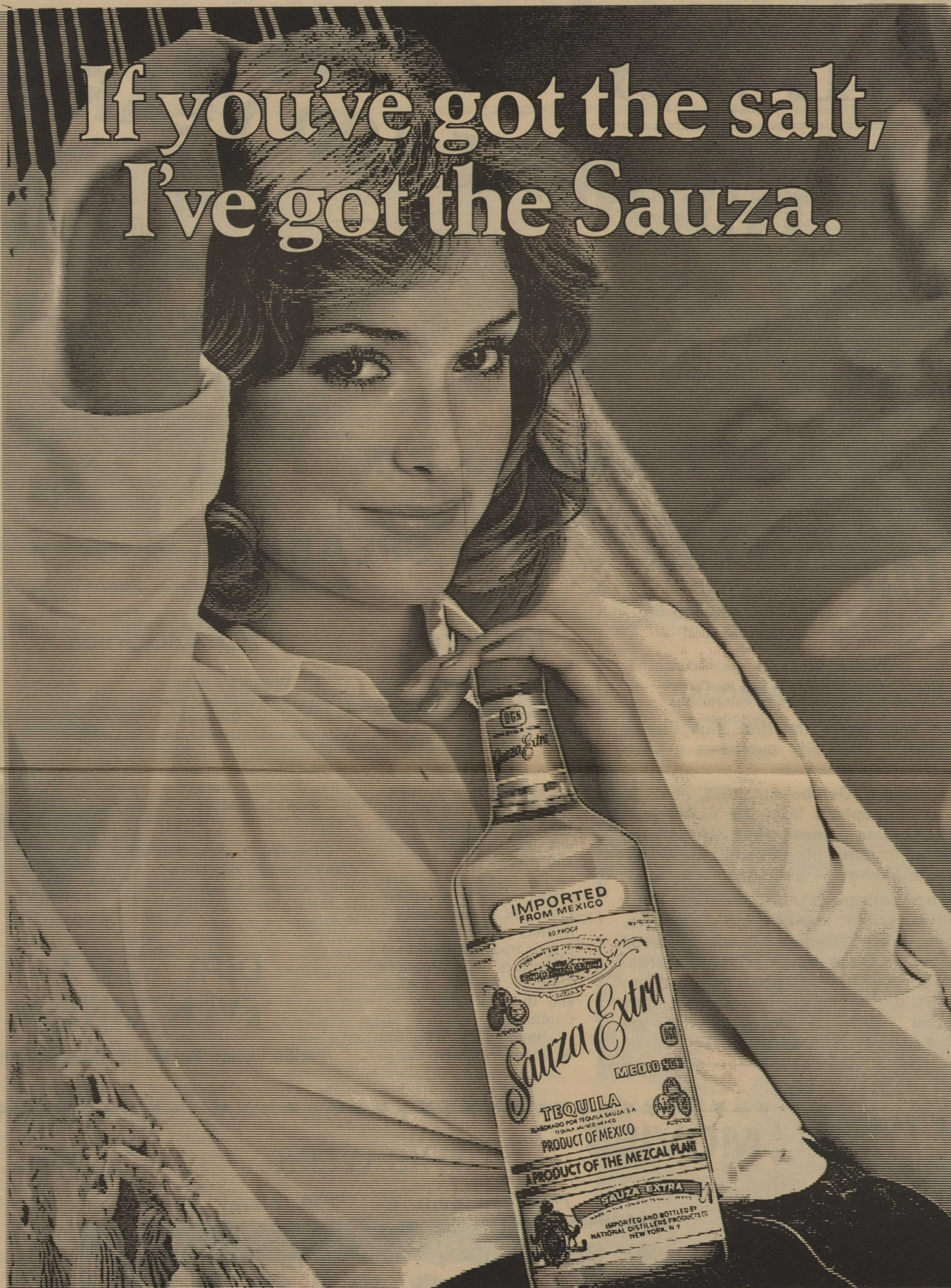

Topics will include Background to African Life and Culture, the Absent Hero in Caribbean Fiction and the Caribbean World and Africa.

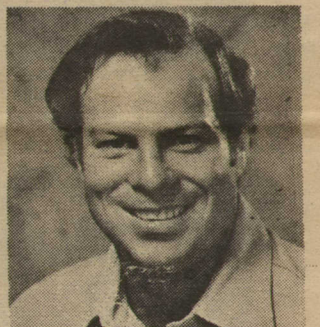

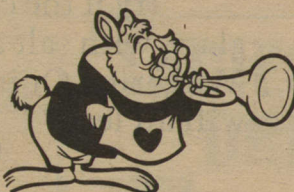
