Ramces Marsilli presents the FIU Libraries Catalog, pointing out ways to use advanced search strategies to find online resources that can be embedded into Canvas courses. Additionally, he demonstrated how search results can be limited to online resources post-search.

Ramces Marsilli presents the FIU Libraries A-Z Database List, pointing out ways to use browse and filter the list to isolate databases by subject and/or type so faculty can find materials to assign to courses.

Ramces Marsilli presents Google Scholar as a potential source for classroom materials, pointing out ways to use advanced search strategies to find materials that can be embedded into Canvas courses. Additionally, he demonstrated how to link Scholar to FIU Libraries so search results get parsed through our citation linker.

Ramces Marsilli shows how to find subject librarians, who serve as resources for discipline faculty to help curate content, manage the research process, and embed materials into the Learning Management System.

Christopher M. Jimenez presents LibGuides as a vehicle to facilitate the partnership between library faculty and discipline faculty in the administration of course content.

Christopher M. Jimenez presents the Library Hacks page as a digital toolbox for faculty to be able to generate proxied URLs, information literacy modules, and our LTI Tools. He demonstrated how the LTI tools for LibGuides and Curriculum Builder can be used to embed library content directly into the Learning Management System.

Christopher M. Jimenez showed the two major partnerships between FIU Libraries and Open Educational Resource providers. Namely, Rice University's OpenStax and the University of Minnesota's Open Textbook Library. He discussed the new partnership between all Florida State University System schools and the OTN and shared that many OER Textbooks will end up in the Catalog soon.
