(patterned after the Oath of Hippocrates)

I do solemnly swear by that which I hold most sacred;

That I will be loyal to the profession of medicine
and just and generous to all;

That I will lead my life and practice my art in uprightness and honor;

The History of the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine

Since the turn of the century, there has been a growing perception that there was a need for more health professionals to serve Florida and specifically the South Florida population. A similar need was noted throughout the United States and prompted the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) to make the recommendation that the number of U.S. medical school graduates be increased by thirty percent over the next decade.

This need also prompted the Florida legislature to consider the option to develop two new medical schools in the State of Florida. As a result of this initiative, Florida International University developed a ten-year strategic plan for health education and biomedical research. This plan initially resulted in the establishment of a College of Health and Urban Affairs with a School of Public Health. Additionally FIU strengthened its biomedical engineering educational and research programs.

In September 2005, FIU's plan for the first public College of Medicine in South Florida was approved by the University's Board of Trustees. In March 2006, the plan for a new College of Medicine at FIU was formally approved by the Florida Board of Governors and later by the Florida legislature, which provided funding to address the growing physician shortage nationwide and provide economic benefits to South Florida and the state.

In the Fall of 2006 Dr. John Rock was appointed as the founding Dean of the College of Medicine and Vice President for Medical Affairs at FIU. Shortly thereafter, the structure of the Dean's Office was completed with the appointment of Dr. Joe Leigh Simpson as Executive Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Dr. J. Patrick O'Leary as Executive Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs, and Dr. Sanford Markham as Executive Associate Dean for Student Affairs. During that time, a number of FIU faculty, along with the new Deans, developed and submitted an application for accreditation by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME), a federally recognized body responsible for the accreditation of medical schools in the United States. The LCME visited FIU in November 2007 to perform a site evaluation of the facilities and operational plan. They provided preliminary accreditation in February 2008 allowing the new College of Medicine to begin operation. Students were recruited and interviewed in late 2008 and early 2009 and the first medical school class began its Orientation on August 3, 2009.

The emphasis of the new medical school is to recruit and educate larger numbers of ethnically and culturally diverse students to serve the growing elderly patient population and to address physician shortages of culturally competent, ethnically diverse physicians in the area. The medical school will provide quality, affordable medical education and educate physicians who are culturally sensitive to South Florida's diverse demographics. The new medical school will help advance South Florida's health care community by facilitating improved access to first-rate medical care among our medically underserved populations and lead an economic impact that will eventually reach more than \$8 billion each year.

Herbert A. Wertheim, OD

Brain Power Incorporated

Dr. Herbert A. Wertheim is an inventor, educator, scientist, eye physician, clinician, entrepreneur, philanthropist and community leader. Dr. Wertheim's enduring discoveries and contributions in eye care and other scientific fields have touched millions during his forty years of patient care and eye research. He and his research team have been granted more than 100 patents, copyrights and trademarks.

Dr. Wertheim founded Brain Power Incorporated (BPI) over 40 years ago. BPI is the world's largest manufacturer of ophthalmic instruments and chemicals for eye care professionals and optical laboratories, with extensive research and manufacturing facilities in the US and Europe. For many years he had a clinical practice specializing in Visual Neurology and Optometry at the University Eye and Medical Center. Dr. Wertheim was a distinguished lecturer in Physiological Optics and Optometry at the world-renowned Bascom Palmer Eye Institute and Adjunct Professor of Physics in the graduate program at the University of Miami. He also served as director of the University of Tennessee Medical School Computer Center, directing more than forty programmers and researchers.

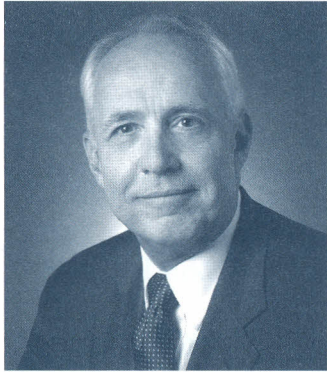
Dr. Wertheim is a graduate of Brevard Community College and the University of Florida, where he studied electrical and computer engineering. He also received a B.S. in optical engineering and a Doctor of Optometry degree from the Southern College of Optometry in association with the University of Tennessee Medical School. Dr. Wertheim was awarded the Doctor of Science, honoris causa, from FIU for his distinguished scientific and clinical discoveries. He has completed graduate studies at Stanford University, London School of Economics, Northwestern University and IMD in Switzerland.

More than 35 years ago Dr. Wertheim was the first to publicize and stress to eye care professionals the prevention of cataracts and the management of other retinal pathology. He emphasized the fact that UV light was a contributing cause of cataracts and retinal deterioration. Dr. Wertheim's invention of UV-400 absorbers for eyeglasses as well as other discoveries have been beneficial in reducing cataracts as well as other eye pathologies.

Dr. Wertheim has served as Chairman of the Board of Directors and Board member of the FIU Foundation from 1988 through 2001. He is a founding member of the FIU Board of Trustees and served as chairman and vice chairman of the University's most successful Capital Campaign, which raised more than 200 million dollars.

As chairman of FIU's Academic Affairs Committee, he conceived and initiated and won approval of the University's Trustees for the Medical College and was asked to chair the Medical College Initiative. In May 2009 he and the Dr. Herbert and Nicole Wertheim Family Foundation made a twenty million dollar contribution that becomes forty million with state matching funds to establish multiple endowments. They support student scholarships, research fellows, leadership lectures, medical community advancement, and eight endowed chairs for the Medical College. In June 2009 the FIU Board of Trustees named the new college the "Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine" in his honor and named him Founding Chairman of the College of Medicine and Trustee Emeritus of the University.

Dr. Wertheim has served as chairman of the Dr. Herbert and Nicole Wertheim Family Foundation since 1977. It has supported hundreds of local and international educational, cultural, sporting and community health care organizations around the world with millions of dollars in financial aid and grants.

Darrell G. Kirch, M.D.

President and CEO,

Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC)

Darrell G. Kirch, M.D. is president and CEO of the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), which represents the nation's medical schools, teaching hospitals, and academic societies. A member of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academies, Dr. Kirch is a distinguished physician, educator, and medical researcher.

Prior to becoming AAMC president in 2006, Dr. Kirch served for six years as senior vice president for health affairs, dean of the college of medicine, and CEO of the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center at The Pennsylvania State University. Before joining Penn State, Dr. Kirch served as dean and senior vice president for clinical activities at the Medical College of Georgia from 1994 to 2000. In addition to these leadership roles, he also co-chaired the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, the accrediting body for U.S. medical schools, and he now serves as a member-at-large of the National Board of Medical Examiners and on the board of directors of Research!America.

A psychiatrist and clinical neuroscientist by training, Dr. Kirch began his career at the National Institute of Mental Health, becoming the acting scientific director of the institute in 1993 and receiving the Outstanding Service Medal of the United States Public Health Service. A native of Denver, he earned his B.A. and M.D. degrees from the University of Colorado, which in 2002 recognized him with its Silver and Gold Alumni Award.
